Children are not taught and one child i.e. if there is an elder daughter then she takes care of the house and the parents look after the outside and another child or two other children bring money like child labor and these people's families run by collecting everything else to raise a red.

It is that one child will earn, another child will save the house and another will get a living child, but the society is not aware that the child is not aware of the sense of play, the sense of education, that is the sense of learning in the four children of the house.
