

Usage Of E-Resources Among The Arts And Science College Faculties Of The Selected Colleges In Coimbatore District.

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Abstract;

The resources which store the information electronically and are accessed with the help of electronic systems and networks are called as electronic resources. The e resources are the collection of data in the form of E-Journals, E-Books, E-Databases, E-Reports, E-Thesis, E-Newspapers, Internet/Websites, CD Rom/DVDs and other portable databases. Objective of the present study is to examine the usage of electronic resources, frequency, purpose, user satisfaction and problem faced by the users using electronic resources in the faculties of Coimbatore district. The study aimed at finding their user of e-resources by the faculty members in the arts and science college libraries. 200 questions were distributed, out of which 150 were returned. The result of this survey are presented and discussed in this paper.

Introduction

This study will bring out the perspectives of the usage pattern and attitudes of the faculties. And also in taking into account of e-resources usage behavior of faculty members of the affiliated colleges of Bharathiar University covering e-journals, e-books, online data bases; e-articles, e-publishing, reference works and so on. This study analyses faculty member's views on opinion on use of e resources. The respondent's behavior and usage and satisfaction level and prospects of using e resources have been analyzed. Further this study analyses respondent's frequency of using various e databases.

Objective of the Study

- To study the use of electronic resources by the faculty
- To find out the purpose for using e-resources
- To find out the satisfaction level of faculty with e-resources

Methodology

To conduct the study, survey method with questionnaire tool was used. A total 200 questionnaires were distributed to the faculty of various Arts and Science colleges in around Coimbatore. However 150 questionnaires were received. Collected data will be analyzed with the help of simple percentage analysis.
